4. PROJECT BUDGET

Provide a budget for the entire project in one (1) page or less, including grant amount requested from SEWISC, matching funds and valuation of in-kind time, if applicable. If other funding will be used, list the funding sources and note if those funds are secured. If they are not, describe the likelihood of securing those funds. Note: SEWISC will rank highly proposals that contribute most to our mission. If your project addresses one or more of the topics below, make sure to describe that in your proposal:

- Commitment to follow-up control work in subsequent years, leading to long-lasting control.
- Priority will be given to projects that target high priority species such as Common Reed (*Phragmites*), Common or Cut-leaf Teasel, Wild Parsnip, Japanese Knotweed, and/or any species listed in the Wisconsin Invasive Species Rule (Ch. NR 40, Wis. Adm. Code) as “prohibited” species.
- Targeted species are relatively new invaders in southeastern Wisconsin or in your project area, or the population is isolated, so this can be considered a “rapid response” project.
- Your project area is a high quality or high priority natural area (e.g. listed as such in regional planning assessments).
- Project has strong public education components.
- Project provides a model approach to invasive control that could be duplicated elsewhere.
- Project brings together partnerships with potential for ongoing impact on invasive species populations.
